




ISE: Integrated Skills in English

Trinity's Integrated Skills in English (ISE) is a contemporary four skills (speaking, listening, reading and writing) qualification available on paper and digitally. It is recognised by governments and institutions as providing reliable evidence of English language proficiency.

- ▶ Trinity's ISE qualification is formally calibrated to the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).
- ISE carries the ALTE Q-mark from the <u>Association of</u> <u>Language Testers in Europe (ALTE)</u>*, having met their stringent quality standards.
- ▶ ISE is available in two modes of delivery: ISE (paper edition) and ISE Digital.



ASSESSING SKILLS IN AN INTEGRATED WAY

ISE assesses students' ability to interact in English in an authentic and meaningful way, through integrated reading into writing exam tasks and integrated listening into speaking tasks. This approach reflects communication in real-life interactive

settings – where we use more than one language skill at a time.

Skills assessed include synthesising information, participating in interactive discussions and presenting on topics of personal interest.

Why ISE?

BUILDS REAL-LIFE COMMUNICATION SKILLS

Candidates develop their integrated, transferable English language skills within real-life contexts. The exam tasks challenge candidates to be flexible in applying their language knowledge. These skills are essential in a range of environments – from study to employment.

EMPOWERING CANDIDATES TO EXCEL

Candidates can choose and prepare their own personalised topic for the Speaking module. This task prepares students for the demands of giving presentations at school, work and university. This approach not only encourages their learning but also instils the confidence needed for them to perform at their best.

CONTEMPORARY APPROACH

ISE supports contemporary teaching strategies such as Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) activities, and develops cognitive processes from understanding overall meaning and catching specific points through to synthesis and evaluation.

What skills does ISE test for student success?

ACADEMIC FOCUS

ISE focuses on the educational domain within the learning or training context where the aim is to acquire specific knowledge and skills (CEFR – Council of Europe, 2001, page 15).

The intended candidates are young people or adults, and particularly those who will use their ISE examination certificate as a means of demonstrating their English proficiency within higher education. In application to university or college, the ISE certificate provides evidence of a student's acquirement of specific English skills and knowledge, to be successful in the classroom and beyond, in their future employment.

Therefore, the exam tasks reflect real-life situations that candidates would expect to encounter at school, college, or university - whether that be academic assignments, communicating with domestic students, or answering questions from their professors.

The assessment goes beyond the confines of grammar and lexis, promoting the development of communicative, study and transferable skills, which are increasingly cited as being important for success in today's world.

ISE Digital - a highly flexible and convenient exam

▶ **Flexible booking:** Candidates can choose from frequent dates and book the exam up to three days before the exam.

▶ **Rapid results:** Results along with diagnostic reports, are available within 3-5 days.

▶ Accessible exams: Candidates can take ISE online at a registered exam centre

Adaptive testing: The test modules are adaptive.
This means that whatever their level, candidates will receive tasks that are appropriate for their language proficiency based on their previous answers.

Designed for the modern world: The exam reflects how modern classrooms, projects, learning tasks, independent research and informal assessments function in today's global environment.

Showcasing digital competencies: ISE Digital has been designed to assess communicative skills within a digital context. The different task types seamlessly integrate digital skills with language skills (speaking, listening, reading and writing). Candidates not only demonstrate their English proficiency, but also their digital literacy, which can be applied in diverse areas of life, including professional settings.

Human assessment: All Speaking and Writing performances are assessed by a highly-trained Trinity College London examiner.

MEDIATION SKILLS FOR MULTILINGUAL CONTEXTS

ISE Digital includes mediation skills, through Listening into Speaking and Reading into Writing tasks – an essential component for multilingual communication, emphasised in the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) since 2018.



What does ISE tell me about students' level of English?

This table shows how the ISE on paper and digital mode of delivery are aligned to one another and to the CEFR. It also shows the alignment between TOEFL iBT, IELTS and the CEFR. All four qualifications test speaking, listening, reading and writing. The scores in the figure are overall scores, not individual module scores.


DIAGNOSTIC FEEDBACK

Trinity's philosophy is to support candidates before, during and after the test. This is reflected in the diagnostic feedback provided for each candidate, in the form of a diagnostic profile report, regardless of their level of achievement. This shows the sub-skills tested for reading, listening, speaking and writing and a candidate's performance in relation to these.

Candidates receive a detailed module report for each skill. The module report gives their module score and the corresponding CEFR level. It also offers diagnostic insights, showing strengths and areas for improvement and includes feedback on how well the candidate used source materials.

ISE students go on to study in institutions all around the world, including in the United Kingdom, United States, Canada, Republic of Ireland and New Zealand as well as many other countries where courses are offered with English as the medium of instruction. Exam and results security

Trinity is committed to ensuring that candidates receive an exam result that they can believe in. We do this through rigorous quality assurance procedures including visits to exam centres, statistical analysis and monitoring, fairness checks and careful management of speaking and writing assessors.

The ISE test is taken under secure conditions:

- A current, valid passport, national identity card or full photocard driving licence has to be shown on the day of the test.
- In the in-centre exam, one invigilator per 15 students is present in the exam room at all times and mobile phones or other electronic devices (including smart watches) are not permitted in the exam room.
- ISE Digital delivers exam tasks to students based on their in-test task performance. This means that candidates will receive exam tasks that are personalised to them, significantly reducing the risk of cheating.

SECURITY AND VALIDATION OF RESULTS

ISE is a test that can be relied on by employers and institutions alike. After results have been released, they may be securely verified via our online system.
