

Books and backing tracks



Drum kit pieces

In addition to featuring pieces by respected professional drummers such as Benny Greb, Trinity has teamed up with specialists, using engaging material that really develops a drummer's all-round musicianship. We have included work by musical theatre expert Chris Burgess, Latin specialist Mike Osborn and jazz drummer Clark Tracey, meaning learners can experience the variety of styles and techniques that drummers really need.

Benny Greb



Benny Greb is one of the most respected drummers in the world today. Not only has he headlined nearly every major drum festival and toured with his clinics and drum camps worldwide, but he is also recognised as a composer and band leader in his own band Moving Parts, which won him the renowned ECHO Jazz award – the German equivalent to the Grammy Awards in jazz.

We are excited to include two of Benny's songs in our syllabus: 'Couscous' at Grade 7, and one of his best-known, 'Grebfruit', at Grade 8, complete with the backing tracks

that are available for download. Trinity worked with the original guitarist for 'Couscous', Chris Montague, to create a bespoke version of the song – together with backing track – specially for the Trinity Grade 7 exam.

Chris Burgess



Chris Burgess' field of interest is musical theatre. 'Broadway Bounce' is an example of a Grade 1 show-style piece that places the student within the soundscape of a theatrical experience. Often in Chris's performance notes, he invites the reader to think about what might be happening on stage at the time or to listen to various parts of the backing, including real-world tempo-change click tracks in some of the later grades. As the student progresses, a wide range of styles and genres are presented including some improvisation work. Well-known shows represented in the syllabus include *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*, *Hamilton*, *City of Angels*, *La cage aux folles*, *Sunset Boulevard* and *Gypsy*.

Broadway Bounce



Mike Osborn



Mike Osborn's forte is Latin music. Latin styles are present throughout the syllabus, starting with a basic *cha cha* at Initial and soon progressing to *bossas* at Grade 3 where the *clave* pattern is introduced. The samba study, at Grade 8, is based on the *batucada* rhythm, which would not sound out of place at the Rio carnival, complete with a whistle part for the student to master.

'Where's Juan?' is a Grade 5 Latin piece, which pays homage to the Dominican pianist Michel Camilo. With drum-feature-rich parts, it's a well-crafted look at the style with a brief soca section for good measure!




Clark Tracey



Clark Tracey is one of Britain's most well-known and respected jazz drummers, and this syllabus has been greatly enriched by Clark's writing and performing at all levels. The language of jazz begins very simply at Initial, where the drums play a duet with the bass. This establishes the importance of the relationship between the two instruments right from the beginning. On this foundation, other jazz features are built such as Latin rhythms, brushes, phrasing, hits and setups, odd time signatures and solos.

This syllabus includes jazz standards such as 'Joy Spring', 'Spain' and 'Caravan' as well as many original tunes written by Clark. One such piece is 'The Genius', a fast swing tune at Grade 6, which pays tribute to Gene Krupa and his signature accented tom-tom style of playing.



Drum kit exercises


The Drum Kit & Percussion Syllabus 2020-2023 is the perfect choice for players who are serious about refining their skills on the drum kit. The technical exercises are unique in the way they explore rudiment combinations in a musical way – drums and cymbals are used in various groove situations by placing them into a performance context. Learning to play fluently with the correct feel, touch and dynamic control is important and the studies really test the students' mastery of these sticking patterns.


From the beginning, students are encouraged to explore the full drum set, introducing four-way coordination and exploring simple movements around the kit to express the techniques melodically.

Grade 6 (extract)



In this B section, six different rudiments are combined to develop the same musical motif with a foot ostinato to anchor the timing, and dynamic variety to shape the mood of the performance.

Grade 8 (extract)



In this extract from the B section, the player gets to explore the kit timbre by playing the snare rim quietly through the metre change. This then leads into a Latin section where the tom toms and cymbal bell are used with a variety of rudiments embellishing the grooves throughout.

Percussion

Our Percussion exams cover the full range of orchestral instruments: tuned percussion, snare drum and timpani. Candidates can choose to take a combined Orchestral Percussion exam or an individual discipline.

Newly commissioned works give candidates a choice of study for all instruments and grades, designed to help them develop essential playing skills and techniques in a musical context.

Pieces and studies play an extremely important role in developing technique, but are also fun and satisfying to play. They encourage students to play musically with ease of movement around the instrument, dynamic control, tonal control, phrasing, articulation and appropriate sticking patterns.

'Blast Off!' from *Introducing Percussion* is featured on the lists at Initial for snare drum, timpani and tuned percussion. All the performance pieces in the book can be played individually or as a group – reflecting the range of ways that students learn – and many feature in the syllabus. Demo and backing tracks are also available.

Introducing Drum Kit

The four tests given for each grade are designed to develop the candidate's abilities in the fields of musical perception, discrimination, memory, understanding and analysis. The tests are carefully graded from application of basic skill to more advanced understanding.



Introducing Percussion

A comprehensive beginners' introduction to the three main orchestral percussion disciplines: snare drum, timpani and tuned percussion. It can be used to develop skills on any one instrument, or all three disciplines alongside one another.
